
## **Meditation Song**

## Introduction

- **Guide:** The first page of holy Scripture underline the dignity of humans. Both woman and man have this great mission: to be image of God for each other, an image of his fidelity, his goodness, his tender love.
- **Reader:** From the book of Genesis 1:26-27; 3:14-17; 3:14-15 (seated)

## Pause

**Guide:** The one who will win evil will be Jesus Christ, the new Adam: but the promise of the Savior is introduced by the image of the humble and courageous woman who is set as sign against the evil one, against all those who in arrogance and pride refuse to adore God and will not love their fellowmen. God promises that the offspring of the Woman will manifest all the goodness and faithfulness of God. He will be the visible God and the new Eve will be His companion in her humility purity.

Mary surely lived most intensely the charism of the Virgin who lives fully in vigilant expectation for the coming of the Lord. Mary is the great sign of promise, the new Eve. Let us reflect and appreciate the charism of vigilance and readiness of which Mary is model.

**Reader:** From the Gospel of Luke 2:19, 33-35, 51-52, 8:19-21, 11:27-28 (standing)

Pause (seated)

**Guide:** Mary concentrated her highest, operative attention and her contemplation the Word Incarnate, whom she had continually before her eyes and in her heart. She was therefore a woman of silence and reflection, of hidden and indestructible fidelity, of total availability to the will of God.

> No one was more closely united to Christ than she because no one was more faithful to the Word of God.

> The consecrated Religious fix their gaze on Jesus as Mary did; we have to be attentive to his Word as it is spoken and celebrated in the Eucharist. Pope Paul VI warns the Religious that without a genuine Eucharistic piety there is no real dedication in the apostolate, nor is there, in any real sense fidelity to vocation.

> Vatican Council II in the concluding paragraph of the Decree on religious life, solemnly invites religious to entrust themselves to the Virgin Mary to make daily progress in their program of sanctity, thus bringing into the world a rich harvest of fruits (P.C. 25)

> Pope Paul VI prays: "May the most loving mother of the Lord, after whose example you consecrated your life to God, obtain for you in the daily course of life that unchangeable joy which only Jesus can confer. Would that your life, patterned after her maternal affection by which all should be inspired to cooperate in the Church's apostolic mission of regenerating mankind." (E.T. 56)
